



PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The SUNY System Administration Building, formerly the Delaware & Hudson Railroad Building, was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1972 and is a public office building located at the intersection of Broadway and State Street in downtown Albany, New York. Locally the building and land it sits on is referred to as State University Plaza, It was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1972 as Delaware and Hudson Railroad Company Building. The central tower is thirteen stories high and is capped by an 8-foot-tall (2.4 m) working weathervane that is a replica of Henry Hudson's Half Moon.

RE&LS conducted a Pre-Renovation Asbestos Inspection, Lead-based Paint Survey, PCB Caulk Survey, and Abatement Design. Each floor had selective demolition for the renovation and SHPO was involved in review of the drawings. RE&LS also provided quality assurance/quality control of the final inspection report. Construction cost \$5 Million.
